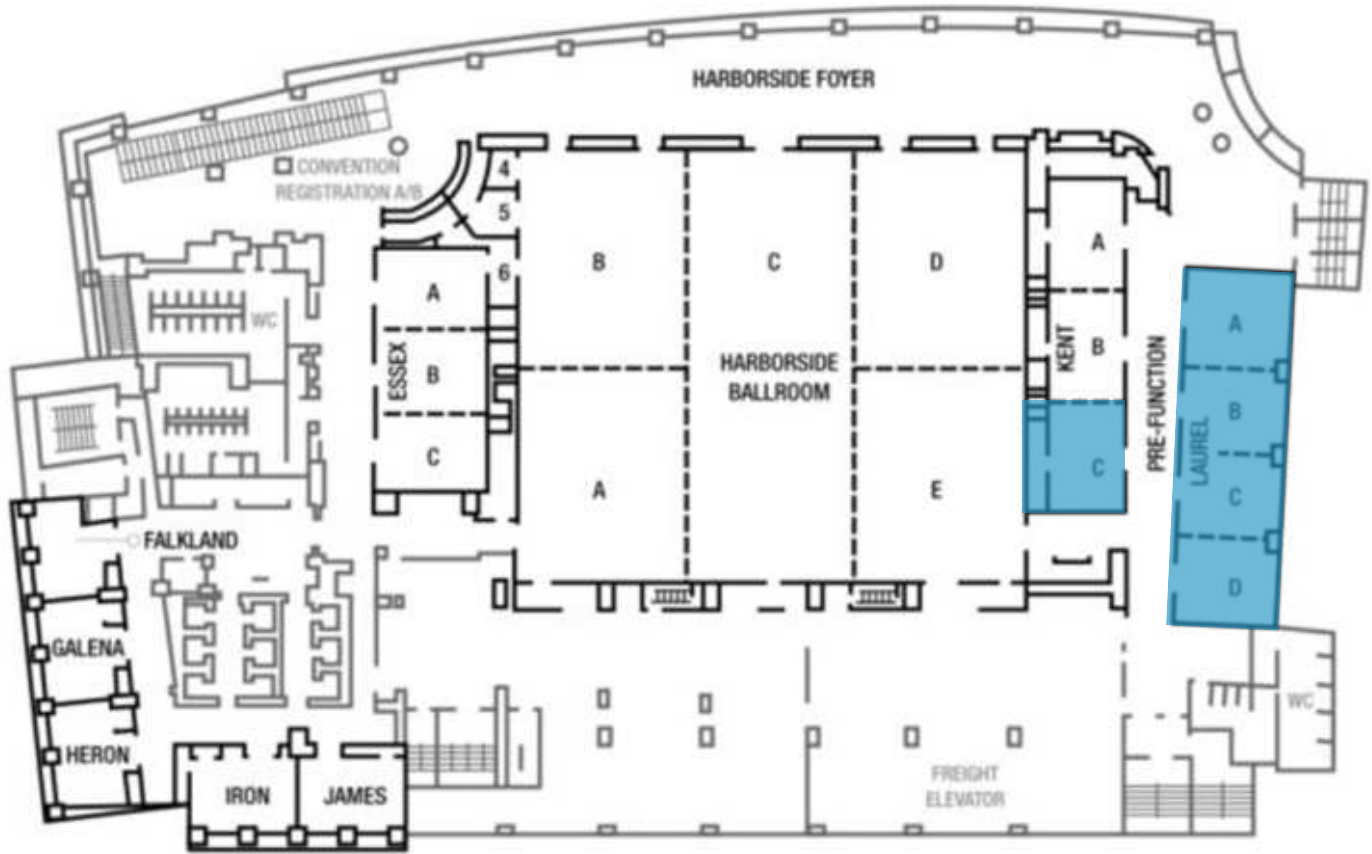

Neurology clerkship and program directors as well as other faculty members are often approached by medical students for advice about how they can best position themselves to successfully match into neurology residency. Data from the National Resident Matching Program show an increase of more than 10% in the number of neurology positions filled by medical school seniors between 2020-2024. This workshop aims to provide medical teachers and educators the information that will allow them to effectively counsel medical students who are increasingly considering neurology as their career choice.

Using Simulations (OSCE/OSTE/AI) to Evaluate Competencies Beyond MK

DESCRIPTION

The session will focus on creating and implementing simulations that teach and evaluate non-medical knowledge competencies, with a particular emphasis on teaching, professionalism, and communication skills. The course will begin with a didactic session discussing the foundations of simulation. This will be followed by a group activity where each group, with the aid of a worksheet, will design a simulation on a specific non-MK topic, including the creation of learning objectives, anticipated barriers, and solutions. The groups will then report out their proposed simulations to the expert speakers who will provide feedback. The course will conclude with a practice simulation followed by discussion.
